Dear Holy Family Catholic Community Parishioner(s),

Our gratitude abounds for the generous support that you and your fellow parishioners have offered Holy Family in this past year—and that you continue to offer. As you may have seen, in June we closed out our fiscal year with a net surplus (including unrealized gain on investments) of \$388,998. This is such a gift, and please know that we do not take it for granted.

The surplus is integral to us completing several projects that are already in progress, as well as those that are to come, in our parish.

Where can you see the surplus at work? When visiting Our Risen Savior Church, you will notice that the parking lot was recently repaved and that new windows were installed inside the church. At St. Peter, we recently installed a new metal roof, which will have a much longer life than traditional shingles. This project was partially funded by a bequest, with the rest coming from parishioner donations and the surplus. Crews have worked at Presentation to clean and fix the church's roof, as well as repair its louvers and gutters. The surplus also allowed us to give an additional gift to St. Mary's Springs Academy to continue their important work of educating our youth in the classroom and in the faith.

It is important to note that this surplus is not the product solely of weekly contributions. While these contributions are critically important to keeping our parish operating, this surplus also stems from several other sources including bequests, investment income, and rental agreements with various organizations.

This past year, we received \$266,255 in bequests. Bequests are contributions allocated to our parish based on the wishes of parishioners who have passed away. Although some parishioners make us aware of these donations in their estate planning, we cannot plan for them when budgeting for the upcoming year.

We seek to ensure that we care for our parish's finances smartly and securely, and this includes through our investments. As you know, the market varies from day to day, and although we have a projected investment return rate, it is simply a projection. Any gains beyond that forecast are an addition to our budget, while any losses subtract from it.

Our surplus draws also from our rental agreements, such as that with ADVOCAP at Sacred Heart School. These agreements, like our investments, vary and as such, are not factored into our budget.

No matter the source of the surplus, we are grateful for all the opportunities it provides our parish to continue operating and remain vibrant. Thank you for your continued support.
