Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

Peace of Christ! Last week, I spent a couple hours at the Shrine of Our Lady of Champion (formerly Our Lady of Good Help) just outside of Green Bay. I prayed for you and your families while I was there. The Shrine is the only approved apparition site of Our Lady in the United States. In 1859, Our Lady appeared to a simple farm girl, Adele, at this place. Our Lady instructed her to go and teach others the faith, especially teaching them about the Sacraments and how to sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross. Adele was confused and unsure due to her own lack of education. "Why would Our Lady choose me?" she may have wondered. Nevertheless, she responded to Our Lady's command to "Go and gather the children" and to "have no fear." She would go door-to-door in her town asking to teach the children there about the faith. Eventually, Adele would dedicate her whole life with this task, founding a schoolhouse and convent where she along with several other women, would work tirelessly for the salvation of souls.

Often times, it is easy to become discouraged by our limitations as well as the limitations of those around us. Yet it is the task of Our Lady and her Son to choose the most unqualified and unlikely of people to be the best ambassadors of the Gospel. Our Lady could have appeared to the most articulate, well-educated, most charismatic people, but she chose simple, uneducated Adele. Our Lord could have chosen the same for His disciples, but He chose twelve mostly uneducated, simple, unpolished men. In His mysterious providence, these chosen instruments were able to bring the Gospel to all corners of the world, and it is this same providential guidance that fills the Church today. In this month dedicated to Our Lady and her rosary, we receive the words of Our Lady to Adele, "Go and fear nothing. I will help you." The most important work we have is to pass on what has been given to us - the gift of the Sacraments, our faith, and prayer. This is something we can always carry with us, whether we are with family, friends, or in simple conversation with a stranger. Our Lord and Our Lady want to use you - yet too often, we give into fear or fail to trust that God can use simple instruments like you and me to boldly proclaim His Gospel. So be not afraid! And be open to how our Lord and His Mother want to use you.

It is a great gift to be your priest. You and your families remain in my prayers.
