He had surgeries for a feeding tube and trach to help him breathe. Javier will receive spinal injected medicine every four months for life. He has a feeding

tube and wears a BiPAP at night. Javier is unable to run or jump and lost his ability to smile. Amelia was diagnosed before she was born. She received a one-time infusion and currently shows no signs of Spinal Muscular Atrophy. All proceeds of the sale will go to the Medina family. Your support and prayers for them are appreciated!



Dear Parishioners,

Dignity is in the being, not the doing.

I recently had the privilege of baptizing one of my best friend's babies. The baptism happened on a Sunday afternoon, outside of Mass. Typically, there would be twenty or thirty people there, but on this occasion, there were almost one hundred.

Why would one hundred people come and celebrate a baby's baptism? What worthwhile thing has a baby ever done? They've never been a useful citizen, never worked hard, never even pitched in with washing the dishes after dinner. They've spent their whole life in need; crying when they're tired, crying when they're hungry, crying when they need to go to the bathroom. Yet if anyone in that church were to call the baby a burden, they would have been roundly criticized.

A baby helps each one of us put on the eyes of Christ – to see that our worth comes from God's willing and loving us into existence, and holding us there at every moment. Think of the beatitudes, "Blessed are the poor in spirit... Blessed are the meek. "God formed us out of love, and is love for which we are made. A baby's poverty is not a hindrance to a mother's care for him or her. Though a baby doesn't "pull it's weight," a baby draws people's attention like a crackling fire, and we feel no desire to pull away.

This is how God sees each one of us. This January, Holy Family is taking a group of high schoolers on a pilgrimage to the annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. There, we will march and pray for those who help us to love, for those who are meek, for those who are poor.
