Orders placed Wednesday through Sunday will be available for pickup at our Parish Office beginning that following Monday afternoon (if you order Wednesday, January 22, you could pick up your wine as soon as the afternoon of Monday, January 27). Pickups will only be available during office hours (7:30 am to 4:15 pm Monday through Thursday, and 7:30 to 12:00 pm Friday). Bottles are \$25 each plus tax. Dear Holy Family Parishioners,

As a seminarian, one is often called upon to give a "vocation-talk" witnessing to how God has called them to consider the priesthood. No two stories are ever the same. Remarkably, however, there is almost always once consistent feature in every man's vocation story. That is, they heard God speak to them in Adoration. Importantly, the same can be said for women who've been called to be religious sisters. In fact, it is striking to hear how prevalent an encounter with the Lord in Adoration is for so many people who have fallen deeply in love with God.

Why is that? What is it about Adoration that is so powerful? We know that we can always pray no matter where we are or what we are doing. We are, after, all, Temples of the Holy Spirit, and God can always be found in the deepest parts of our souls. But there is something uniquely special about Eucharistic Adoration.

It is often said that Christ established the Sacrament of the Eucharist for precisely the same reasons that He became Incarnate for us. That is, Christ desired to become man for us because He desired to dwell among us as Emmanuel "God-with-us." He desired to be with us because He loved us – so much that He would give up His life for our sake.

When we reflect upon the Incarnation, we can't help but call to mind Christ's immensely merciful humility, and to recall the words of the Prophet Isaiah, "There was in him no stately bearing to make us look at him, nor appearance that would attract us to him...oppressed and condemned, he was taken away, and who would have thought any more of his destiny? [Yet]...Through His suffering, my servant shall justify many, and their guilt he shall bear."

God comes to us in a hidden way in the Eucharist, under the appearance of a simple host of unleavened bread. In the midst of the cacophony raining down upon our senses every day, Adoration is a respite, an oasis in the spiritual desert. While we strive to maintain the frenetic pace of our lives, and all the while remain much the same – Christ graciously gives us the opportunity to come to Him – He who is the same, yesterday, today, and forever, and offers to change our hearts, as He gently loves us in the silence.

If you have not already visited our Adoration Chapel at Sacred Heart Church, I heartily encourage you to do so. Our Lord is lovingly waiting to embrace you there, no matter in what you state you may come to meet His gentle gaze.

If you are so moved, please also consider signing up for an hour of Adoration on a weekly basis. We want to keep our Adoration Chapel open

to everyone and keep it running strongly. To sign up, please visit https://fonddulac.weadorehim.com/.
