Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Next Sunday, February 2, the Church will celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, marking forty days after Christmas. As a feast dedicated to our Lord Jesus, it takes precedence over the Sunday in Ordinary Time when it falls on a Sunday.

Interestingly, the Presentation of the Lord is still considered a "Christmas feast" despite not being part of the Christmas season. This is because it is the final feast of the liturgical calendar that commemorates Christ as an infant.

Like other Christmas feasts, the themes of light and hope are central to this celebration. The feast emphasizes Christ as the light who brings purification and liberation from the dark powers of the world. Throughout history, Christians have carried candles in procession to symbolize our role as baptized Catholics to bring Christ's light to a darkened world.

This feast is also commonly known as Candlemas. During this Mass, candles are traditionally blessed for the upcoming year. The name "Candlemas" itself reflects the theme of Christ as "a light to reveal [Him] to the nations," a prelude to the ultimate Feast of Light: Easter. The blessing and procession of candles at this feast point directly to the significance of the Paschal Candle at Easter.

Next Sunday, we will begin Mass at the back of the Church, where we will bless all candles brought by the faithful. Like Christians of old, we will then process into Mass with our lit and blessed candles.

We encourage everyone to bring candles to be blessed for use throughout the year.
