Dear Brothers & Sisters,

When doing a tour throughout the church, I love to stop in the Sacristy and ask people about the vestments and specifically the different colors that are used within the Mass. Each liturgical color carries its own symbolism:

- I usually start with the color that I am wearing. We agree that black is not a happy color, and it is a symbol of death and mourning. The priest wears black to showcase that all will pass from this world. Traditionally, black has been used at Masses for the dead.
- On the flip side, white signifies the opposite of death which is life and the resurrection. It is the white garment that we all received at our baptism and carries the symbol of purity and freedom from sin. It is used during the feasts of Our Blessed Lord, the Blessed Virgin, and many other saints.
- Red is used on two Sundays. On Palm Sunday it symbolizes the blood of Christ that will be spilled throughout Holy Week, but on Pentecost it represents the fire of the Holy Spirit. It is also worn for any saint that, like Christ, offered his blood and life as a martyr.
- Green reflects life and things that are growing. In this way during Ordinary Time, we are called to continue to grow in our faith.
- Violet/purple is a more somber but regal color. It is not as dark as black but still is not a color of rejoicing. Violet denotes penance and preparation, and it is used during both Advent and Lent.
- Rose is a joyful color, used on Gaudete and Laetare Sundays, signifying a moment of anticipation and rejoicing in the more somber penitential seasons of Advent and Lent.

Symbols and thus colors are important in the Church, for they point us to an inner spiritual reality that is occurring around us all the time. So next time we go to Mass let us ponder and contemplate on the many different symbols especially the colors used in the Church.
