HOLY FAMILY WARMING SHELTER: OVER 100 DAILY ACTS OF COMPASSION

Since opening our doors on November 1, the Holy Family Warming Shelter—which only serves single adults—has become a vital resource in our community. Every night, we provide a safe haven for up to 36 individuals, ensuring they not only have a place to rest but also receive comprehensive care throughout the day.

Three Meals Daily

Each client receives three nutritious meals every day: a hearty dinner in the evening, a wholesome breakfast in the morning, and a convenient lunch to go upon departure. This means our 36 guests enjoy a total of 102 meals daily, with an additional 6-8 meals distributed to community members who are not staying with us. Together, we serve 108-110 meals every day.

Daily Hygiene and Laundry Services

In our commitment to dignity and health, we provide 15-18 showers every day, ensuring our guests have the opportunity to refresh and care for themselves. Additionally, we manage 20-30 loads of laundry daily, so everyone can start each day with clean clothing.

These daily acts of care—from shelter and meals to showers and laundry—are made possible by the dedication of our staff, volunteers, and the generous support of our parish community.


