Learn about signs of drug, alcohol use and addiction at talk April 29

Learn about the signs of drug and alcohol use and addiction, and how you can help your loved ones experiencing it at the "From Awareness to Action: Recognizing Substance Use in Your Family and Finding Support" presentation from FDL County Drug Court Coordinator Jennifer Laning, CSAC, on Tuesday, April 29 from 6:30 to 7:30 pm in Holy Family Hall. Laning will discuss signs that parents, grandparents, and guardians should look out for in their children, and how to identify various drugs. The presentation will also feature a talk from a member of the recovery community sharing their experience with addiction and recovery. Information will be available on resources accessible to those who are struggling with addiction and those who are in recovery.

On the fourth Sunday of Lent, with the parable of the prodigal son, we had the opportunity to meditate on the great love that God has for us. Luke tells us that: "While he, the prodigal son, was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him." How is it possible that the father saw him while he was still far away? Because the father never gave up hope that his son would return, despite everything—his son's attitude and the disappointment it caused him. He never lost hope; a hope sustained by the love of his great love.

True hope does not give anyone up as lost. Not losing hope for the return of his son made it possible for the father to leave the house every day to look out on the road in case he saw his son return. If he had stayed at home, locked up in his disappointment, he would not have seen him arrive when he was still far away. Hope is what moves us to see, welcome, and embrace those who return home, or even approach them for the first time.

All the father's love for his son gives free rein to feelings when he is already close to him. He is moved, he runs, he throws himself around his neck, he kisses him—all excessive, at least that's how it seemed to the older brother. But it is the excess of love and joy of a father who never lost hope that his son would one day return home. May the older son share in the joy of having a merciful father. Hope never disappoints, said St. Paul in his letter to the Romans.
