Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the rich man who builds bigger barns to store his surplus grain, only to discover his life will be taken that very night. The message is clear: we must not place our trust in material wealth. What matters to God is not what we own -but how we love, serve, and live. We may not build barns, but we do build our own versions: bank accounts, comfort zones, and sometimes even walls between us and others. Jesus warns us that these things will not last. The only treasure worth storing up is the treasure of grace —lived out in compassion, mercy, and generosity. As a Church, and especially in the diaconal ministry of service, we are reminded to care for those in need, to be good stewards of what we have, and to keep our hearts fixed on what is eternal.

Reflection Questions for the Week:

- What are the "barns" in my life?
- What am I storing or clinging to that may be keeping me from being "rich in what matters to God?"

Lord, help us to let go of greed, fear, and pride. Teach us to be generous and to live each day mindful that our lives are in Your hands. Make us rich in the things that truly matter. Amen
