A LETTER FROM YOUR HOLY FAMILY PRIEST | FORGIVENESS AS A PATH OF HOPE

In the last article, I spoke about rituals to strengthen hope. One dimension of rituals is rereading the past. In the Mass, for example, we hear God's action in ancient times. We do so not from nostalgia, but from the hope of the present, that God not only intervened in ancient times but continues to act in our lives. The readings from the Old and New Testament remind us of this. The past, seen through the eyes of faith, urges us to enjoy God's presence in the present and, if we experience a crisis, to wait on the Lord who heals wounds and restores strength. In the experience of forgiveness, human beings can redefine the past, not justifying the wrongs suffered, but rather giving it a new and liberating meaning. German philosopher Hannah Arendt speaks of promise and forgiveness as concepts that preserve human areas from their constant fragility; forgiveness refers to past actions, while promise refers to future consequences. To forgive is to rewrite history; only through forgiveness can slavery be avoided. That is why the people of Israel must remain in the desert for 40 years before entering the Promised Land, because they must heal the wounds of slavery: mistreatment, humiliation, abuse, etc. Only through healing the past and forgiveness can they enjoy the Promised Land.
