

As part of National Hunger & Homelessness Awareness Week, Fr. Matthew Kirk will bundle up and climb up onto the roof of the Holy Family Warming Shelter on November 18, and remain on the roof until the shelter raises \$55,000 - 25% of its annual budget.

That day, staff will be joined by community leaders to discuss homelessness in Fond du Lac County and efforts to respond. The public will also have the opportunity to take tours of the shelter and learn more about how they can get involved. For a donation, the community will have opportunities to send Fr. Matthew warm items, food, drinks, and comforts, as well as bathroom passes.

Like Fr. Matthew, those experiencing homelessness must endure the elements for hours if they do not have any shelter to go to. Unlike Fr. Matthew, without the support of the community, our neighbors in need may not have a warm place to go at the end of the day.

A Note from your Pastor: An update on our Priest Team

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Last month, I shared with you that Fr. Kevin Tanel was temporarily stepping back from ministry to address mental health concerns he has been facing.

Recently, we received word that Fr. Tanel is extending his health leave until further notice as he continues to address these concerns. Although this news may come as a surprise and disappointment, I am grateful that Fr. Tanel is receiving the thorough help he needs at this time. As I shared in September, it is of vital importance that we make caring for our mental and physical health a top priority, and we will continue to support Fr. Tanel as he does so. Please continue to keep him in your thoughts and prayers. We look forward to welcoming him when he returns at some point in the future.

We have been blessed that Archbishop Grob has appointed Fr. Patrick Behling to our parish as an associate pastor effective November 1. Fr. Behling holds degrees from St. Olaf College, Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology, and the University of Saint Mary of the Lake. He was ordained into the priesthood in 2016 at the age of 26, which at the time, made him the youngest priest in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Since that time, he has served at St. Charles Parish in Hartland, St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish in North Lake, and St. Mary's Visitation in Elm Grove. He also served as the Spiritual Advisor at Lake County Life Teen.

Fr. Behling is an academic theologian by training, and has interests in the spirituality of the priesthood, religious life, and the papal teaching office. Prior to becoming a priest, he served as a US Senate Page, and member of the Senate floor staff. He is also a huge Brewers fan, avid reader, and cellist.

At Holy Family, Fr. Behling will fulfill many of Fr. Tanel's responsibilities and reside at the rectory. We look forward to him joining our Priest Team and sharing his ministry with us.
