# A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | Hope in the God of life

The reflections I have shared have been about the gift of hope, since, as Catholics, we have been called this Jubilee year to focus our attention on this theological virtue. I want to focus on this occasion on the promise of resurrection, since we are approaching the celebration of All Saints' and the Faithful Departed. Saint Paul will say in his letter to the Corinthians that if Christ did not rise, then our faith is in vain. Therefore, our hope is not limited to the goods of this world; it transcends them in the hope of the resurrection, which inspires hope in the heart of the believer. Believing in the resurrection is to hope in the triumph of life over death, of good over evil; it is to behold the cross and know that injustice does not have the final word, that the violence and persecution of the powerful in this world will not prevail, and that the betrayal and abandonment by friends will not stop God's work. It is trusting in the presence of love that upholds hope even in the threshold of death, that a mother at the foot of the cross is a source of strength for the abandoned child, that family members around a sick person in the hospital room are a sign of hope for those suffering the distress of the approaching death. Giving to God what belongs to Him is growing in faith; it is the cry of Jesus on the cross: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." Father, into your hands I entrust what is yours, the life of my late mother, father, grandfather, uncle, etc. It is the heart-wrenching cry of imminent death, but it makes God present with all His strength and love, embracing the beloved Son, believing that the same happens with our loved ones whom we entrust to God in the hope of resurrection.

May All Saints' Day and Faithful departed increase in us the hope of the resurrection and the faith that in God we all live, for God is not a God of the dead but of the living.
