A Letter from your Holy Family Priest | DILEXI TE

Papal Documents are classified as follows: 1. Encyclical Letters, 2. Encyclical Epistles, 3. Apostolic Constitutions, 4. Apostolic Exhortations, 5. Apostolic Letters, 6. Bulls, and 7. Motu Proprio. If it is official it appears in the Acta Apostolicae Sedis. The first official document of Pope Leo is an apostolic exhortation, which is a type of magisterial document issued to encourage and guide Catholics in their spiritual and pastoral lives. Unlike encyclicals, which are more doctrinal and solemn in nature, apostolic exhortations are more pastoral and are intended to motivate the faithful to put certain aspects of the faith into practice.

In the exhortation *Dilexi Te*, which means, "I have loved you," the Pope emphasizes that love for the poor is not a secondary option, but the very heart of the Christian faith. In them, Christ continues to speak and act in history. For Christ himself, though rich, became poor so that we might become rich through his poverty. The way Christ enriches us is not through power and opulence, but through simplicity. From the Old Testament, and particularly in the Exodus, God appears as the one who cares for the poor, the widow, and the foreigner, for the people of Israel had experienced poverty and slavery.

Jesus himself identifies with the poor: "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." That is why, as the Pope tells us in his exhortation, we find imprinted in the wounded faces of the poor the suffering of the innocent and therefore the very suffering of Christ. I believe that the Holy Family Warming Shelter is a powerful response to Christ's call to care for the poor, for they are our brothers and sisters. The presence of foreigners and migrants is also a sign of Catholicism in our community, since we, the baptized, form one body regardless of nationality. The Pope calls us to treat with dignity and respect those who are marginalized in society; undoubtedly, the homeless and migrants are part of this group.
