Divine Mercy Sunday to be celebrated April 12

We welcome all to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday at Holy Family from 2:00 to 4:00 pm on Sunday, April 12. On Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus promised us that: *"the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me."* Join us as we honor this special day with prayer and reflection. While Mass will not be celebrated, Confession will be offered from 2:00 to 3:30 pm, Silent Adoration from 2:00 to 3:00 pm, and the Divine Mercy Chaplet from 3:00 to 4:00 pm followed by Benediction. In order to reduce long lines, prayerfully consider going to Reconciliation 20 days before or after the Feast Day. Attending 12 Hours of Reconciliation counts towards this.

Fr. Ryan Pruess to lead Men's Retreat April 24-26 in Waukesha

Any man looking to deepen their spiritual life is invited to join Fr. Ryan Pruess on a Men's Retreat at the Schoenstatt Retreat Center in Waukesha from 6:00 pm Friday, April 24 to 1:00 pm Sunday, April 26. This retreat will focus on prayer and penance for one's family, especially those in our families who may not be practicing the Faith. The goal will be to equip and refresh men of any age with the spiritual tools to protect and encourage devotion within their families and the Church. The weekend will consist of Mass, communal prayer, confession, individual prayer, Adoration, and Benediction. On holy days we are called to meditate on the mystery of salvation manifested in the death and resurrection of Christ. The sacrifice of Christ is described by Saint Paul as atonement since Jesus has abolished our sin by nailing it to the cross. This sacrifice is the free giving of life on our behalf; "you do not take my life, I give it, and I have the power to take it back." The best-known attempt to explain the necessity of Jesus' suffering on the cross is that of Saint Anselm of Canterbury, known as the father of scholasticism. In his satisfaction theory, sin demands satisfaction without which forgiveness from God would be impossible. Human beings cannot fulfill this requirement by their own power. The death of Jesus is necessary so that God can forgive the sins of humanity. Satisfaction is a demand of justice and must be the work of a member of humanity. God Himself becomes man to open the way to His infinite mercy through the fulfillment of due justice.

We offer to the Father the only perfect sacrifice every time we gather around the Lord's table. Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father. One of us, our elder brother, has purchased our redemption at the price of blood; by his wounds we have been healed. He is our Savior because he achieves for us what we could not achieve by our own effort, which is communion with God. Celebrating Holy Week, especially the Easter Triduum, is celebrating our redemption; death does not have the last word, Christ has triumphed on the Cross, and we are participants in such a great Mystery. May this Holy Week that begins remind us that we have been called to life.
